Ed Kardauskas has served as a security consultant to government and major corporations for over 20 years, and is the fifth person worldwide to earn all 3 American Society for Industrial Security board certifications - Certified Protection Professional (CPP), Physical Security Professional (PSP) and Professional Certified Investigator (PCI). He is also certified in Homeland Security (CHSIII) by the American College of Forensic Examiners. Prior to joining SafirRosetti, he served as a Captain and Acting Chief with the 200 officer City of White Plains, NY Police Department, and in several corporate and regional security management roles in private industry. He earned a Bachelor of Arts Degree from Manhattan College, and is a graduate of the FBI National Academy. Mr. Kardauskas has extensive experience with integrating risk based security programs into corporate business strategy for measurable returns on investment. He has worked extensively in threat, risk and vulnerability assessments, physical security strategy and design, criminal and non criminal investigations, critical incident management, business continuity planning, workplace violence prevention and response, security officer program management, and coordination of

private security operations with the services of public sector emergency response agencies. He has designed and managed headquarters and regional security operations and systems for national and international corporations, managed enterprise wide security integration projects throughout North America, and managed a national security command center. He is accomplished at writing and managing security policies and procedures, designing metrics and reporting programs, and conducting security audits. During his police career in White Plains, he served as the commanding officer of the Uniformed Operations Division, the Burglary Squad, the Crime Prevention Unit, the Training and Special Projects Division, and the Community Oriented Policing Unit. He was the senior incident commander at thousands of crime scenes and emergency events, and has testified as a court certified expert witness on locking device technology and lock penetration techniques.

### Reminders about Monthly Luncheons

Happy New Year! I’m very excited to serve on the Executive Board for the North Texas Chapter. I hope to represent the chapter as well as my predecessor and continue to administer strong business practices. Here are a few reminders about our monthly lunches:

We will continue to have our monthly luncheons on the second Thursday of each month from 11:30 AM to 1:30 PM at Texas Instruments (South Campus, Gate 1). The address is 12500 TI Boulevard, Dallas 75243. The cost of the luncheon is \$30 per person.

As in 2007, we strongly urge you to use PayPal as the payment method for chapter events. Pay Pal is a highly secure and nationally recognized payment service that allows members to use major credit cards for on-line reservations. All of these transactions are fully insured by Pay Pal. Because of this, we are granting a discounted luncheon price of \$25 to those members who pay via PayPal. You may book your luncheon reservations on-line at our [NTX ASIS Chapter](http://www.ntx-asis10.org) website.

Our luncheon catering costs have risen significantly

because the chapter has had to absorb financial liabilities resulting from repeated “No-Shows” – individuals who reserve a seat, but don’t pay for the luncheon on-line or in-person. Consequently, the Board must enforce the following reservation policy:

- Reservations must be made 48 hours before the luncheon. If you fail to make a reservation, we can not guarantee you a meal. Please note that members are always welcome to attend monthly meetings without purchasing a meal.
- Cancellations will be accepted 48 hours before the luncheon event, with any pre-payments carried over to next scheduled luncheon.
- Cancellations with less than 48 hours notice and all “No-Shows” will be billed by the Chapter Treasurer for the cost of the meal.
- Only credit cards will be accepted at the door for meal payments. No checks or cash will be accepted.
- Again, the cost is \$25 for those who pay on-line via PayPal. For those who pay at the door, the cost is \$30. ## Code of Conduct at Chapter Meetings

ASIS International has adopted a position on professional conduct at chapter meetings for members who supply goods or services.

As an organization of professional security practitioners, it is desirable that chapter meetings be held in an atmosphere free of uninvited commercial distractions. ASIS endorses a policy that prohibits members who provide and sell security or consulting services from initiating a sales effort immediately before, during, or after a chapter meeting while at the meeting location.

Adherence to this policy will result in maintaining an atmosphere in which members are able to discuss matters affecting their profession without being the object of a sales presentation. This policy does not prohibit an organized program wherein a service company may present the program from that day, nor does it prevent a member in the service industry from responding to an inquiry.
