## Reminders about Monthly Luncheons

The monthly luncheons are on the second Thursday of each month from 11:30 AM to 1:30 PM at Texas Instruments (South Campus, Gate 1). The address is 12500 TI Boulevard, Dallas 75243. The cost of the luncheon is \$30 per person.

You are strongly encouraged to use PayPal as the payment method for chapter events. Pay Pal is a highly secure and nationally recognized payment service that allows members to use major credit cards for on-line reservations. All of these transactions are fully insured by Pay Pal. Because of this, we are granting a discounted luncheon price of \$25 to those members who pay via PayPal. You may book your luncheon reservations on-line at our [NTX ASIS Chapter](#) website.

Our luncheon catering costs have risen significantly because the chapter has had to absorb financial liabilities resulting from repeated "No-Shows" – individuals who reserve a seat, but don't pay for the

luncheon on-line or in-person. Consequently, the Board must enforce the following reservation policy:

- Reservations must be made 48 hours before the luncheon. If you fail to make a reservation, we can not guarantee you a meal. Please note that members are always welcome to attend monthly meetings without purchasing a meal.
- Cancellations will be accepted 48 hours before the luncheon event, with any pre-payments carried over to next scheduled luncheon.

3. **Please submit a one page synopsis for these two questions:**

  - b. **Why would you be the right candidate to be nominated for the APC I Course?**
4. Chapters can submit only one applicant. National Officers and Directors of the Society are not eligible to participate.
5. The recipient must be a member in good standing that has never attended the APC I course.
6. The Award covers the tuition, transportation and hotel (room and tax for 5 nights) costs for the APC I course. Hotel and travel arrangements must be made through the ASIS travel agent. Air travel will be in coach class.
7. Applications will be reviewed and the winner selected. Winner will be notified immediately. The name of the winner will be announced in the seminar.
8. All other applicants will be notified of winner selection.
9. The Timothy J. Walsh APC I Award is based upon on the performance and commitment to obtaining a certification through ASIS. This award is targeted at those who have experience in the security industry and are looking to develop their skill in to the fields of asset protection.

Criteria and Information

1. The ASIS Foundation scholarship committee will select the Timothy J. Walsh APC I Award annually, after review of application material. Chapter and employer references, membership standing, commitment to the academic program, and other specified criteria will be considered. Parameters for selection include commitment to careers in the security profession, merit, traditional progress toward certifications and career advancement.
2. Awards may be made to all ASIS members in good standing. Consideration will be given to applicants with outstanding credentials that are relatively new to the industry and looking to advance their careers.
3. Members must submit an application and all required information by the deadline. Phone call or letter will notify recipients no later than stated date each session.
4. Completed application form with all supporting documentation must be emailed or faxed within one week. No late applications or parts of the application packet will be accepted.
5. The award is intended to be used during the traditional APC series year (fall through spring), and for academic purposes such as tuition, fees, room, board, and/or books.
6. The ASIS Foundation scholarship committee

reserves the right to determine if an award will be given.

7. Scholarship funds are payable to educational institution(s) and recipient(s). Exceptions to this policy can be made by decision of the ASIS Foundation scholarship committee based upon individual circumstances.
8. Relatives of the current ASIS Foundation scholarship committee and ASIS Foundation board of trustees are ineligible.
9. Scholarship recipient selection(s) will be made without regard to race, age, gender, religion, political beliefs, employment status, or any other factor, which could constitute unfair or illegal discrimination.
10. Members must be in good standing, have a minimum of a one year of service with ASIS and at least two years of security experience
11. Members must submit application completed in its entirety to be eligible.
12. Decisions of the ASIS Foundation scholarship committee are final in all matters related to the above practices.
