## 2008 Annual NTX Chapter Scholarship Competition

During December of each year, our Chapter in conjunction with the ASIS International Foundation, awards a minimum \$1000 scholarship for academic excellence to a student enrolled in a security-related field of study at an accredited college or university in northern Texas. Since 1993, the North Texas Chapter has awarded over \$14,000 in scholarship monies to undergraduates attending regional universities such as the University of Texas-Arlington, University of North Texas, and Eastfield College. Our chapter funds a \$500 annual scholarship and the ASIS Foundation provides matching funds for an education award to a chapter member, student member, or student nonmember. If a chapter scholarship is awarded to a chapter member, the Foundation then contributes twice as much as the chapter, up to \$1,000. If a scholarship is awarded to a student member or a student nonmember, the Foundation matches the amount up to \$500. Chapter scholarship awardees are also eligible to compete for an additional \$500 ASIS Regional Vice President (RVP) Scholarship Award. Each RVP selects one scholarship winner from among the nominating regional chapters. Several NTX Chapter awardees have also been recipients of a Region VI RVP Scholarship.

In short, a chapter member could receive up \$2,000 in scholarship money this year, while a student could receive up \$1500 in scholarship money. The scholarship check can be used by the awardee to defray various college-related expenses such as tuition, room and board costs, textbook purchases and lab fees. Recipients will also receive an award plaque from the chapter recognizing their achievement.

Scholarship candidates must be part-time students working in the security field or full time students majoring in Criminal Justice, Security Management, or a related discipline and have completed at least one year of study at an accredited North Texas college or university. A minimum grade point average of 3.0 (on a 4.0 scale) is required for consideration. (A sealed certified transcript must accompany the application.) A letter of recommendation from a faculty member of the college or university in which the candidate is

presently enrolled must accompany the application. The candidate is also required to submit an original essay of 1,000 or more words on a security-related topic of his or her choice, in their application packet.

Doctoral candidates are not eligible. Students in fields of study other than security—such as business, engineering, architecture, criminology, international affairs, law, and public administration—are encouraged to participate. Perspectives from these fields and others are clearly relevant to assets protections in today's global environment, and offer valuable insights to contemporary issues of interest to the ASIS community.

#### Format:

#### Requirements:

- Times New Roman, Book Antigua or Arial 12-point font (tables, charts & footnotes may use smaller font size)
- Word count between 3,000 and 6,000 words, not including appendices or attachments
- Illustrations, charts, tables, graphs that reinforce content are acceptable
- 1½ or double-spaced
- Use of recognized styles, such as APA, Chicago/Turabian, or MLA

#### Application Process:

Each student's completed application must be mailed to the Foundation by the competition deadline. An application includes a completed paper e-mailed to [bbuzzell@asisonline.org](mailto:bbuzzell@asisonline.org) and mailed to the Foundation along with the application, an official transcript, and a letter of recommendation from a faculty member. ## Teamwork Brings Us Through Hurricane Ike

*The Houston area has been flirting with hurricanes all this season, and escaping relatively unscathed each time. Once Hurricane Ike drew a bead on Galveston, we knew we were in for big trouble. As the storm raged outside, Houston Northwest Medical Center suffered from problems with wind, water and power, but through it all, our amazing staff and physicians did their jobs, maintaining a high level of patient care, and saving a few lives along the way.*

Ike. Who would have guessed that a storm with such a short name would pack such a large punch? Ike threw everything it could at Houston Northwest – howling winds, penetrating water and swirling debris.

As the eye passed overhead in the dark of night, we experienced immense challenges. Many of these we prepared for and some were unforeseen - but in the end we adapted and our patients were safely protected and cared for by a dedicated team of healthcare professionals.

During and after the storm, we have had a large number of support staff who joined our family around the clock; Physicians, Sheriffs from Rockwall County, Fuel Drivers from Virginia, Tactical Paramedics from Cypress Creek EMS, HAM Radio operators, relief nurses, electricians and many others who felt the call to serve. Universally, they have voiced their opinion about the team work, camaraderie, can-do spirit and deliberate calm of how we responded during the disaster. We have also been heralded by others who we supported after the storm, including the water district whose generator failed at a critical time.

Our response and ability to continuously serve patients from

our community and afar did not happen by chance. Maintaining a continuous state of readiness; preparing for at least 96 hours of no outside support; and conducting drills year round made Ike a less forceful opponent. We also owe our families gratitude for preparing themselves so that we could serve. Almost all heeded the message “to have a plan, make a kit and stay informed”.

While recovery was short for Houston Northwest Medical Center it is taking much longer for our community, physician offices, other hospitals and many mem-

bers of our own team whose homes have been affected. As Texans, it is in our DNA to help others. Whether it’s passing ice out to those without power or helping with FEMA and Tenet Disaster Relief applications, there have been countless stories of staff helping each other.

Thank you for your dedication, compassion, service and for helping serve so many critically ill Houstonians during our time of need. It is another testament of our collective contributions to the welfare and public health of our community.
