International membership is the vast array of professional development and networking opportunities available to all members. When I became your Chapter Chairman, I stated in my first column that I had three overarching objectives for the NTX Chapter in 2007. My first objective was to ensure we provided multiple opportunities for the professional development and knowledge certification of our membership. Our chapter study groups, ably coordinated by our Chapter Secretary Martin Cramer, were again recognized by the ASIS Professional Certification Board as being one of the top chapter certification preparation programs in ASIS International. Current reference materials, detailed Power Point presentations and group lectures led by subject matter experts were provided free of charge to all interested members. Nearly a dozen chapter members earned a CPP or PSP designation this year. Plus the Executive Board has completely revitalized the Dennis A. Noggle Endowment Fund which will provide tremendous oppor-

tunities to members seeking financial support to participate in ASIS seminars and workshops in 2008.

My second objective was to provide forums for the sharing of best practices in the field of security management. Through the outstanding communication efforts of our Chapter Vice Chairman Steve Castor and our webmaster Brad Hellums, our members were kept fully informed of security education activities and other events through our chapter’s monthly electronic newsletter and continually updated web site. Our chapter hosted monthly luncheons covering a wide range of security topics such as transportation security issues, financial fraud under the Sarbanes-Oxley Act, computer privacy & security issues, the risks of urban detonation of Weapons of Mass Destruction, pandemic planning for the DFW metroplex, detecting terrorists in America, and corporate security compliance requirements under Texas Chapter 1702 rules. The highly knowledgeable speakers on these topics represented an equally diverse range of organizations such as the FBI, TSA, Dallas Health and Human Services, and the Texas Department of Public Safety, as well as companies located in the metroplex. Also there were plenty of peer-to-peer exchanges during these luncheons.

My third objective was to support networking activities which acknowledge opportunities for service within the security field. Our nationally recognized Law Enforcement Appreciation Night (LEAN), masterfully led by the dynamic duo of Bob Smoot and Jim Dollar, hosted several hundred of the metroplex’s finest in an evening of food, fellowship and fun at the Eddie Dean Ranch. Also in attendance was the senior leadership of ASIS International. Most notably, a record-breaking \$23,000 was raised in ticket sales during this 43<sup>rd</sup> year of LEAN. Our annual charity Golf Tournament, well coordinated for the fourth straight year by multi-hatted John Hewitt, hosted 47 teams at Hyatt Bear Creek Country Club. The monies raised by this tournament resulted in a check for \$8,000 being presented to the Assist the Officer Foundation. Keeping the financial wheels well greased for both of these events were Chapter Treasurer Michael Finnegan and Chapter Vice Treasurer Michael Adams. These two officers had the demanding responsibility of keeping the books straight (and the IRS happy) for a chapter whose annual operating budget exceeds sixty thousand dollars. Not an easy task.

My deepest thanks to my fellow Executive Board members and the many volunteers who staffed our chapter committees in helping make 2007 another highly productive and successful year for the North Texas Chapter. I hope you are as pleased as I am with the caliber of the incoming NTX Board. We are also fortunate to have John Hewitt becoming our new Regional Vice President and Mike Crocker becoming our new Senior Regional Vice President. I will be returning to serve once again on the chapter Scholarship Committee. I strongly urge all members to look for ways to help serve this chapter and ultimately yourself through the committees seeking chairmen and volunteers in 2008.

I hope to see you at our Christmas Party where we will toast another successful year as one of the oldest, largest and certainly most active chapters in ASIS International. I believe our chapter’s next fifty years to be full of promise. It has been my distinct honor and pleasure to have been your Chapter Chairman during this memorable Jubilee Year.

## ASIS North Chapter Board Meeting Secretary Notes

The North Texas Chapter Executive Board Meeting was held on Nov. 13, 2007. The following agenda items were discussed and voted on. The 2008 Executive Board Members were elected at the November Chapter luncheon. The CPP Fall Review at Nokia Headquarters has concluded. CPP and PSP reviews are planned for early next year.

The Board approved the Guideline for the Dennis A. Noggle Endowment Fund. The Endowment Committee consists of the following permanent members: a Chairman (approved by the NTX Chapter Executive Board), the Chapter Assistant Treasurer, the Scholarship Committee Chairman, the CPEC Chairman, and the Certifications Committee Chairman.

Grant requests must be submitted to the Committee Chairman using the current grant request form. Requests will be accepted and reviewed by the Committee throughout the year. Individuals in good standing with ASIS International, who have been members of the North Texas Chapter for the past two years, are eligible to request a grant. Only ASIS-sponsored security education programs are eligible for grant consideration. The focus of these grants is primarily to cover the costs of seminar/workshop materials and registration fees, and not associated meal, travel and lodging expenses. Chapter members who have received a Noggle Grant in the past three years are ineligible. Neither current Noggle Endowment Committee members nor those who have served on the committee in the past year are eligible for grants.

The December **Chapter Meeting / Christmas Party** is scheduled at the City Club on the 69<sup>th</sup> floor of the Bank of America Plaza building on December 12 at 6 P.M. 2008 Chapter Officers will be sworn-in and awards will be presented at the meeting.

Bank of America Plaza is located at 901 Main Street in downtown Dallas. Free parking will be provided at the Texas Club parking garage located at Lamar and Main Streets.

## Code of Conduct at Chapter Meetings

ASIS International has adopted a position on professional conduct at chapter meetings for members who supply goods or services.

As an organization of professional security practitioners, it is desirable that chapter meetings be held in an atmosphere free of uninvited commercial distractions. ASIS endorses a policy that prohibits members who provide and sell security or consulting services from initiating a sales effort immediately before, during, or after a chapter meeting while at the meeting location.

Adherence to this policy will result in maintaining an atmosphere in which members are able to discuss matters affecting their profession without being the object of a sales presentation. This policy does not prohibit an organized program wherein a service company may present the program from that day, nor does it prevent a member in the service industry from responding to an inquiry.

Executive Committee,

On 11/1/07 an audit was conducted of the financial records of the North Texas Chapter. The committee was very pleased with organization of records, checks and receipts. The following are the results of the audit;

- At the beginning of 2007 the executive board added the savings account to the checking account, bringing the starting balance for January 2007 to \$9493.37.
- Income ... Debit recorded in Quicken matched the bank statements for each month.
- A random audit of invoices and checks listed in Quicken matched paper records in the files.
- All expenditures were deemed legitimate and meet ASIS standards.
- Records for the major events such as Golf Tournament and LEAN, were up to date.
- The current bank balance for the chapter is \$11,674.00.
- All paper records were neat and concise and were maintained in individual folders filed by the month.

The current bank balance matches the current bank statement, less an expenditure of \$1767.00, an overage due to ASIS International not debiting the chapter for; 10 CPP study guides purchased in February. Treasurer Michael Finnegan will contact National to see if this can be rectified.

The audit committee would like to thank Michael Finnegan for creating a great system that can easily be maintained and kept up through transitions of newly elected treasurers.

# Certification News

The Fall CPP review at Nokia Headquarters has concluded. CPP and PSP Reviews are scheduled in the second quarter 2008. Karl Konosky, CPP has volunteered to coordinate the CPP review next year. The fall CPP moderators included several new CPP's and some long time CPP review volunteers; Mo Oglesby, CPP, David Justice, CPP, Carl Konosky, CPP Mike Adams, CPP, Joe Hendrix, CPP, Cal Brim, CPP, and John Hewitt, CPP. Iris Casco at headquarters has updated CPP credits for 2007 moderators.

ASIS has formed a task force to evaluate how many CEPC credits will be awarded to CPP's that moderate certification review sessions. Our goal is to award credits based on the review preparation including material and time at the session. This is a great way for new CPP's and PSP's to maintain their certification.

## 2008 Certification Credits

The standard unit of measurement for participant credit is the Continuing Professional Education (CPE) credit, in which one hour of credit is equal to at least 50 minutes of classroom time. Time for lunches, breaks, social gatherings, planning sessions, business meetings, and similar activities will not be included. Certificate/letter of completion and agenda that includes the hours of classroom time are required. CPEs may be awarded for non-instructional credits based on the following guidelines.

Participant credit is defined as instruction in a formal class setting and includes an instructor, a written course outline, record of attendance and issuance of a certificate of completion.

### **RECERTIFICATION TERM**

The recertification term shall be three (3) years for each certification commencing January 1<sup>st</sup> and concluding December 31<sup>st</sup>.

### **MEMBERSHIP IN ORGANIZATIONS**

**CPP:** Four (4) CPE credits per year, limited to twelve (12) CPE credits per term for membership in a nonprofit professional security or security-related organization or association.

Four (4) CPE credits per year, limited to twelve (12) CPE credits per term for membership in a nonprofit business management-related organization or association.

**PSP:** Four (4) CPE credits per year, limited to twelve (12) CPE credits per term for membership in a nonprofit professional physical security or security-related organization or association.

**PCI:** Four (4) CPE credits per year, limited to twelve (12) CPE credits per term for membership in a nonprofit professional investigation or other security-related organization or association.

### **SEMINAR/CONFERENCE**

CPE credit for attending security and management single and multiple-day seminars and conferences may be claimed based on the number of available 50 minute classroom sessions the certificant could reasonably attend in their entirety.

**Safety-related Programs:** Up to 21 CPE credits per term for attending or speaking/teaching in the areas of safety, environmental safety fire prevention and personal protection single and multiple-day seminars and

conferences may be claimed based on the number of available 50 minute classroom sessions the certificant could reasonably attend in their entirety.

### **ACCREDITED COLLEGE COURSES**

Security/management-related accredited college courses may be claimed and computed at the rate of seven (7) CPE credits for each semester hour completed. This includes internet/distance learning and CD ROM or other self study program that results in accredited college or university credit.

### **CHAPTER MEETING AND WEB BASED**

CPE credit for attending educational meetings of any length and web-based training may be claimed with no maximum limit. Meetings must have a formal speaker, or facilitator and relate directly to the competence (domains) of the applicable certifications. Meetings must be at least 50 minutes in length for each CPE credit hour claimed. Time for lunches, breaks, social gatherings, planning sessions, business meetings, and similar activities will not be included. A question and answer period may be included. A chapter officer must submit a list of verified attendees to the Certification staff in order for participants to receive CPE credit.

### **CORRESPONDENCE AND SELF STUDY**

Correspondence and self-study courses require a final examination and an issued certificate of completion. The issuing authority will determine the number of credit hours each course is worth and the Certification staff shall translate them into CPE credits.

### **EXHIBITS ONLY PARTICIPATION**

Three (3) CPE credits may be awarded for participation and/or attendance at each security-related exhibit.

### **INSTRUCTOR CREDIT**

The topics of the courses must be relevant to the practice of security or, for CPPs, management i.e., the domains for each certification examination as defined by the PCB.

20	Per topic, initial preparation or major modifications of course work for serving as principal instructor or speaker for a security or business management-related (CPP only) course at an accredited college or university.
12	Chapter Certification Study Courses: Planning the entire Study Course including multiple meetings.
9	Chapter Certification Study Courses: Mentoring a student thru the entire Study Course or fulfilling a specific role in conduct of the course.
3	Per participant hour, as an instructor, speaker or panelist at a security or business-related (CPP only) education program .

### **AUTHOR CREDIT**

The topics must be relevant to the practice of security or (CPP only) management, i.e., the domains for each certification examination as defined by the PCB.

45	Per security related and or business management (CPP only) book.
9	Per security-related and/or business management (CPP only) article in recognized periodical.
9	Per monograph, booklet or contribution of chapter to book on security-related and/or business management (CPP only) topics.
3	Acceptance by the ASIS Council of Business Practices for each case study submission.
3	Each book review published in recognized periodical.

### **VOLUNTEER SERVICE, CREDITS PER TERM (CPP Certification Only)**

A maximum of 50% of total credits may accrue from volunteer service. Credits are per year:

30	Member of an Executive Committee of a chartered security organization or association.
25	Member of a national or international Board of Directors of a chartered security organization and President of the ASIS International PCB.
21	Member of a Certification Board, on a national level, of a chartered security organization
